
**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ADDENDUM #5 TO THE AGREEMENT


WHEREAS, the Borough desires to adopt Addendum #5 to the Agreement, which will decrease the Nominated Demand allocated to the Borough annually.





**ADDENDUM #5 TO THE
COMMODITY-DEMAND REGIONAL WATER SALES AGREEMENT
BY AND BETWEEN
NEW JERSEY-AMERICAN WATER COMPANY, INC. AND
THE BOROUGH OF WOODBURY HEIGHTS**

This Addendum No. 5 is made as of this ___ day of _____ 20___, by and between New Jersey-American Water Company, Inc., a public utility corporation of the State of New Jersey with its principal office at 1 Water Street, Camden, NJ 08102 (“NJAW”) and the Borough of Woodbury Heights, with its principal address at 500 Elm Avenue, Woodbury Heights, New Jersey 08097 (“Purchaser”).

WHEREAS, NJAW and Purchaser are party to a Commodity Demand Regional Water Sales Agreement dated as of November 1, 1999 (“the Agreement”) that provided for a Nominated Demand of 64 thousand gallons of water per day (“TGD”);

WHEREAS, On November 1, 2009, as per Section 15, the Agreement automatically renewed for its first of two ten year terms; and

WHEREAS, On November 1, 2019, as per Section 15, the Agreement automatically renewed for its second and final ten year term; and

WHEREAS, NJAW and the Purchaser agreed to and executed four Addendum’s to the Agreement, Addendum #1 on November 1, 1999, Addendum #2 on April 14, 2009, Addendum #3 on November 23, 2009, and Addendum #4 on March 30, 2012;

WHEREAS, On May 31, 2019, the Purchaser submitted a timely letter requesting a 32 TGD decrease to the daily Nominated Demand which would bring the Nominated Demand from 157 TGD to 125 TGD;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of mutual promises and other adequate consideration, the parties hereby agree to amend the Agreement as follows:

1. The Nominated Demand shall be decreased by 32 TGD, from 157 TGD to 125 TGD (*See attached revision to Schedule A of Agreement*) effective January 1, 2020.
2. The Borough understands and agrees that the decrease to its Nominated Demand set forth above will take place automatically on the date set forth and cannot be reduced further during the remaining term of the Agreement, and that the Township will be responsible, as set forth in the Agreement, to take or pay for its Nominated Demand as adjusted by this Amendment 5.
3. All other terms and conditions in the Agreement shall remain in full force and effect, except as expressly amended.


